Items of Interest

The County's sales tax issue for the Courthouse was approved at Tuesday's election. As we discussed in our budget conversations, once effective the City will receive an anticipated \$175,000-180,000 in annual revenue. See the Shawnee Mission Post story [here](#) for more information.

Replacement of the sidewalks at the Community Center continues and we should be in our home stretch. The sections in front of the natatorium were removed this week, and replacement of those sections has begun.

Now that Fall is upon us, the street sweeper will be a common sight around town. As a reminder, please refrain from blowing leaves and other debris out into the street. The sweeper cannot handle that much debris. Also, please do not place leaves in storm water inlets. Inlets can become clogged and may lead to flooding during rain events.

The first of two meetings with local business owners regarding the proposed changes to the sign code was held this week on Thursday morning at the Community Center. Danielle Murray made a brief presentation of the proposed changes and discussed the impacts with the three businesses owners in attendance. She was joined by Mayor Schowengerdt and Councilmembers Nick Schlossmacher and Kristin Inman. The next meeting will be Wednesday November 16th from 5:30-6:30 PM at the same location.

Mission Police Officers responded to the following locations for emergency calls for service:



Officers responded to **216** calls for service. Officers responded to **1** commercial alarms and **0** residential alarms.

During the week of 11/3/2016 to 11/09/2016 the Investigations Division assigned 7 cases to Detectives for investigation.


