CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

Police Chief Ben Hadley is excited to announce the Mission Police Department's 2017 Citizens' Police Academy. This ten-week program will run Thursday evenings from March 2, 2017 through May 4, 2017. Classes will begin at 6:30 p.m. and end around 9:00 p.m., and are designed to be both educational and enjoyable.

Our goals are to introduce ourselves, to share our enthusiasm for the work we do, and to give everyone an opportunity to better understand how the Mission Police Department works. During the academy you will be exposed to these and many other topics:

Criminal Investigations	Interview and Interrogation Techniques
Death Investigations	Domestic Violence Situations/Response
Patrol Operations	Search and Seizure
DUI and Traffic Enforcement	Defensive Tactics
Less-Lethal Weapons	Firearms

You will also be afforded behind the scenes tours of the Johnson County Adult Detention Center, Johnson County Emergency Communications, and the County's state of the art Criminalistics Laboratory.

The Academy concludes with a graduation dinner on May 4 to celebrate your achievements. Graduates will receive a framed diploma and learn about future events where you will have the opportunity to assist your police department. The academy is offered at no cost, but applicants must reside or work in the City of Mission, be at least 18 years of age, and pass a background check.
