

City of Mission Snow Operations Facts

- Mission Public Works operates two 12-hour snow shifts of 4-5 crew members.
- When snow is imminent, moving parked vehicles off the street will expedite snow removal.

Mission Snow Removal Route Maps

- There are four routes; two that focus on main thoroughfare streets Routes A and B on the maps below, and two that focus on the residential streets Routes 1 and 2.
- Streets are prioritized by terrain, visibility, and amount of traffic. For instance, a street with hills and corners will take priority over a street that is flat and straight.

Driving and Parking Restrictions in weather events

- The City Code section pertaining to driving and parking restrictions during winter weather is copied below.


[Section 315.050 Snow Emergency – Driving and Parking Restrictions.](#)

A. *Driving Emergency.* When snow, sleet or freezing rain is causing slippery or hazardous conditions which might lead to serious traffic emergency and until such emergency is terminated, no person shall operate a motor vehicle on any street in such manner or in such condition as to allow or permit such vehicle to become stalled by reason of the fact that the driving wheels of such vehicle are not equipped with effective tire chains or snow tires.


B. *Parking Emergency.* Whenever snow has accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate, all vehicles parked on streets must be removed upon either of the following conditions:

1. When snow has accumulated to a depth of four (4) inches or more; or
2. Any other time as declared by the Mayor or his/her designee. When snow removal operations have been completed, vehicles may park on the streets.
