Hello everyone. I can't recall if we were supposed to submit comments ahead of our next meeting, but here is my very initial feedback regarding the photos of signage Laura provided to us at our August 19 PRT Commission meeting:

Some considerations for content: park name, address, city website URL, city logo

Prairie Village Schliffke Park: I like the reverse type in the lighter color with the dark background more than the gray cement-looking name with dark type. The 'reverse type' looks more sophisticated.

Gum Springs Park: the cement-look for the sign isn't graphically pleasing. And, I think the concept of stacked-stone will become outdated in 10 years. Seems it's appearing everywhere. I DO like the Shawnee logo inlay within the stone, though.

Sycamore: looks cheap and 'cold'...and it's a bit too contemporary for our city.

Brookdate: I don't like the white or the variety of design. Only the type is consistent...I think the look of the signs should also have a sense of consistency.

Fairway: I like the variance in the use of stone (not stacked). Might be too much of the stone.

Merriam: boring?

Parklane: the rusty metal look with the cement blocks seems 'harsh'.

Rushton Meadows: the font is ugly and dated. The design isn't bad. I would avoid using wood...but a bronze metal might work for the supports (but not the sign itself).

Pomona & the 'alien': I actually don't mind the overall 'concept' of the same *type of look* with the use of different materials.

Lexington Park: nope. Doesn't seem to represent Mission. The white is a bit off-putting.

Victoria Grove: too busy. Too big. Too much going on graphically.

Big Bull Creek: not bad—the stone is better than stacked stone (like on Fairway's sign). The sign concept is just OK. I like the use of the address (though would the number, only, suffice?). This uses the web address, too, which is a good idea. Possibly too much information on this sign, though.

Dogwood: boring. Not attractive.

****Mission became a city in 1951. Possibly a more 50s look (popular these days) would be interesting to consider. Something timeless?**
