Sustainability Commission Minutes

I. Welcome and Introductions

Chair John Arnett welcomed everyone to the meeting.

II. Approval of the November 6, 2017 minutes

Andy Hyland moved to approve the minutes. Terri Baugh seconded the motion. The commission approved the minutes.

III. Sustainability Scorecard, refresh and update

Josh Thede shared an overview of traditional building codes and certified LEED requirements. There are many similar elements shared between the LEED guidelines and Mission's Sustainability Scorecard. The group discussed the role that a scorecard could play encouraging local developments to include more sustainable elements in their design and construction. The group restated that it remains a concern about how to objectively determine when a development complies with some of the more technical requirements. Josh Thede volunteered to draft a new version of the Scorecard that encouraged a narrative format of response from developers, and provided examples of the type of project elements that would satisfy the goals of each category.

IV. Old Business

Review of America Recycles Day November 15

Terri Baugh and John Arnett recorded a short clip highlighting the recycling bins on Johnson Drive and providing information on what can and cannot be recycled. The video had 351 views after one day of being posted.

Review of Handlebar Happy Hour November 16

Terri Baugh, John Arnett and Josh Thede attended the event. Over 50 bikes were collected at the event, which were added to the 25 that had been collected through word of mouth ahead of the event. It was a very fun evening, with many people staying the entire length of the event, with great representation from the Mission biking community and friends of BikeWalkKC.

Review of table at Holiday Lights and Festive Sights December 1

Terri Baugh provided an update on the Holiday Lights and Festive Sights event on December 1. The Sustainability Commission table was well attended, and the commissioners handed out 150

recycling fliers from RecycleSpot as well as candy, and engaged with visitors about what goes in and stays out of the curbside recycling bin.

The commission discussed the possibility of a handout.

V. New Business

Possibility of a Night to Unite in Mission

Terri Baugh shared information she had seen on an event called Unite the Nite in Plymouth, Minnesota. Similar to the National Night Out, with an emphasis on neighborhood unity and connection as well as crime prevention. The group discussed existing events that take place in Mission, and decided that there are many opportunities to build community. If possible, additional elements of safety, connection, etc. could be added to those existing events.

Holiday impacts to 2018 meetings (January and July)

The first Monday in January is a holiday. The group agreed to meet on Wednesday, January 3 at 6:30 p.m. The group agreed to keep their regular meeting on Monday, July 2, 2018.

VI. Battery Recycling Update

Emily Randel shared the battery recycling tracking sheet. Since February 2016, the program has turned in 914 pounds of batteries for recycling and spent \$1,557 on 27 battery boxes and one drop off at a local recycling business.
