- II. Public Comment
  - None.
- III. Sustainability Moment
  - Lynn commented on the recent Thanks for Seniors event at the PCC and asked if there was a sustainable opportunity there with the dishes used to serve food since she noticed all plates this year were just thrown away.
  - Jenn noted her daughter brought back batteries to be recycled from her part time job cleaning Airbnbs rather than just throwing them away when they get swapped out at the properties.
  - Cathy commented on resources available for those who are downsizing specifically regarding what can actually be recycled/donated.
  - Alex noted the beer brand Fat Tire has a carbon neutral collaboration going on with the brand Vans.
- IV. Approval of the November 4, 2024 meeting minutes
  - Cathy moved to approve the meeting minutes. Lynn seconded the motion. The Commission approved the motion.
- V. 2024 Budget Update and Discussion
  - Justin presented an overview of the SC's 2024 budget. He noted there were still an outstanding invoice or two remaining in 2024 but there were still some funds available.
  - The SC voted to earmark any remaining funds to the PRT for tree purchases in Mission parks.
